Our Lord will not allow the tavakkul of believers go to waste. He will not abandon us.

He will protect His believers when things are difficult and protect us when we need Him.

In this light, we should remember these amazing verses from the Qur'an;

"That is instructed to whoever should believe in Allah and the Last day. And whoever fears Allah - He will make for him a way out. And will provide for him from where he does not expect. And whoever relies upon Allah - then He is sufficient for him. Indeed, Allah will accomplish His purpose. Allah has already set for everything a [decreed] extent."

What we can understand from these verses from the Qur'an are that, the doors of sustenance are opened through tavakkul and ensuring that we do not disobey Allah's commands.

Dear Congregation!

Allah is the provider of rizq or sustenance. However, our rizq is also connected to the work and effort we put in. As the ayah below demonstrates "And that there is not for man except that [good] for which he strives"
